Mr. McClure (Ron)

Shane, if you can call the roll.

Mr. Farnsworth (Shane)

Mr. McClure.

Here.

Mr. Rauck. (Jim)

Here.

Mr. Mulvaney. (Bryan) Here. Mr. Farnsworth. We have a quorum.

Mr. Farnsworth

Tim Moloney, Executive Director of the Columbus Metro Parks presented the Park's long range master plan and vision for the region. Mr. Moloney discussed the recent development of the Great Southern Metro Park and their intention to connect this park with the Scioto Metro Park in Jackson Township. It was discussed how Jackson Township could support those efforts through property acquisition, trail development, and land use decisions.

A resolution was presented to authorize staff to be added as signatories onto Jackson Township banking, savings, and investment accounts. Mr. Farnsworth stated he needed signatures and then I've got a letter that would then go to Vinton County Bank. I would ask if you're okay with approving that, just have you sign that with a signature.

Okay, now you want to talk about anymore? Any questions about that? Okay, you want to call the roll?

All right. Oh, here, go ahead and tell them about that.

Mr. Farnsworth

And then, while you're doing the signatures. So, thanks to Mother Nature and some scheduling, we're looking really with the building maintenance to go a little longer than we anticipated. And so, Ron and I have had a couple conversations about the summer cleanup program. It used to be all summer long. Well, that's not going to happen. So, we're looking at doing the last Friday and Saturday of each month, starting in May. June, July, and August.

And so, we did this last year. Friday during normal business hours, Saturday 8 to 1. We would have at least one person from the road department here on Saturday working a little extra time to make sure we got the backhoe coverage in case somebody has something big. And then Wright Graphics has already provided us some flyer Newsletters. Excuse me, not a newsletter, but just a postcard. And we'll have not just these dates, but we'll have like the e-waste pickup, and we'll have the shred day, and some of the other stuff that's coming up in September and October. We'll have all of that on that postcard, and we can get those mailed out very, very quickly and designed. We have all those dates already, but if this is more of just, we want your reaction to this. Is this something you want us to do?

Mr. Rauck

Do we need four or is 2 enough?

Mr. Farnsworth

In May, we'll probably need four. We're going to get slammed. But in the rest of them, we'll probably go down to three.

Mr. McClure

Big beginning.

Mr. Farnsworth

Because we'll do tires, bulk, and metal scrap.

Mr. McClure

Oh, Bryan, you seconded it.

Mr. Farnsworth

That's what we would do.

Mr. McClure

Sign the second piece there. Sorry.

Mr. Rauck

You're saying every one of those four days?

Mr. Farnsworth

On May, on May that 29th and 30th, we'd have 4 dumpsters. Because I think we're going to get slammed. After that we may not need four.

Then it kind of trickled off.

Mr. McClure

Okay. That sound good?

Mr. Farnsworth

So, we'll have two bulk dumpsters, tire dumpster, and metal scrap. And then we might go, in June, July, and August, we might go to maybe a 10- or 20-yard dumpster for metal scrap. Go something a little smaller.

Mr. Rauck

And when people bring tires in, let's just, since we don't really pay to get rid of them, I mean, it's part of our, take whatever you got. I hate refusing people to bring in 10 and we're saying you can only drop 4.

Mr. Farnsworth

If they're bringing five or six or seven, we don't care.

Mr. McClure

We don't want 20 or 30.

Mr. Farnsworth

No, the problem is if somebody comes in with a trailer load, and what do we do with those? They all go to Liberty Tire.

Mr. Rauck/Mulvany

them out of all our schools too.

Yeah.

Mr. Farnsworth

Thank you. That is it.

Mr. Rauck

Seems like there's something else.

Mr. McClure

Okay.

That's still good. So, we'd need a motion.

I'll make a motion to adjourn. And since he's here, second.

Mr. Mulvany

Second.

Mr. McClure

All right, go ahead.

Mr. Farnsworth

All right. Mr. Rauck. Yes.

Mr. Mulvaney.

Yes.

Mr. McClure


