

Jackson Township Right-Of-Way Permit

The Jackson Township Board of Trustees require any person to obtain a permit before installing a driveway culvert or making any excavation in a township road or road right-of-way within its jurisdiction, except an excavation to repair, rehabilitate, or replace a pole already installed for the purpose of providing electric or telecommunications service in accordance with Section 5571.16 of the Ohio Revised Code to work within the public rights-of-way of Jackson Township.

Proposed Activities:

1. Include plans indicating the location, size, type, and duration of the culvert or excavation to be contemplated.
2. Specify methods of excavation, refilling, and resurfacing to be followed.
3. Provide information for the use of warning devices necessary to protect travelers on the highway.
4. The Township may require the applicant to post a deposit or bond, with sureties to the satisfaction of the board, conditioned upon the performance of all conditions in this permit.

TERMS and CONDITIONS

The Holder of this Permit shall be responsible for the replacement of the pavement, shoulder, berms, drainage courses, pipes, guard rail, plant material and turf to an original or better condition, and shall properly maintain the pavement, berm, and storm drainage facilities until fully restored to its original condition. All trenches excavated with the roadway will be backfilled with Item 636, Controlled Density Fill (CDF) or as otherwise specified in writing to the satisfaction of the Township Road Superintendent. The Permit Holder shall provide for the maintenance of traffic at all times as provided for on the plans and shall provide and maintain at all excavations in the road suitable barricades and safeguards including the display of steady burn, type "C" lights at night. The Permit Holder is prohibited from trespassing upon or working on any private property without the express approval and consent of the property owner.

RELEASE and HOLD HARMLESS

Furthermore, this Permit Holder shall at all times indemnify and hold harmless the Jackson Township Board of Trustees, its employees and assigns against all claims from injury or damage to persons or property that maybe be asserted by any firm, person, or corporation arising out of the use and occupancy of any part of the road and/or road right-of-way.
